The Portland Place Book Club have been very much enjoying this year's shortlist, and on Wednesday the 21st of June, the winner was finally announced! It was firm favourite, *The Blue Book of Nebo* by Manon Steffan Ross. The announcement reads as follows:

For the first time in the awards almost 90-year history, the **Yoto Carnegie Medal for Writing** is awarded to a book in translation – *The Blue Book of Nebo* (Firefly Press), written and translated by **Manon Steffan Ros**. Told through the dual narrative of a mother and son in post-apocalyptic Nebo, this “compelling, conceivable” story explores Welsh identity and culture, and offers a beautiful appreciation of language. The original Welsh publication, *Llyfr Glas Nebo*, won multiple awards, including the 2019 Wales Book of the Year.

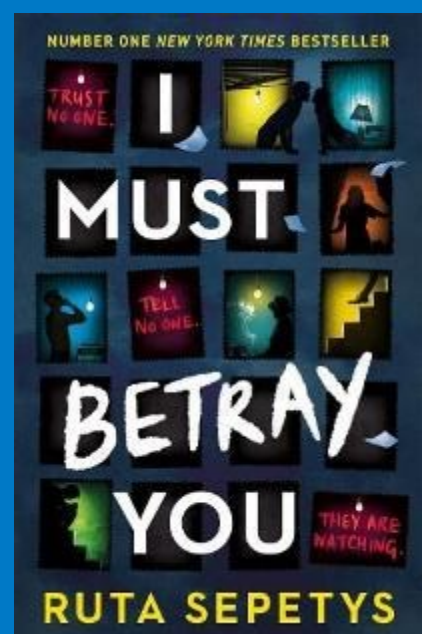
Janet Noble, Chair of Judges for The Yoto Carnegies 2023, said: “In *The Blue Book of Nebo*, the world building and distinct voices of the two main characters, the son and his mother, are expertly realised and the reader is compelled to question their own relationship with the modern world. Thanks to the young readers far and wide who have engaged with our shortlists and voted for their own deserving Shadowers’ Choice Medal recipients.

Prolific Welsh writer **Manon Steffan Ros** lives in Tywyn, North Wales. She has written over 23 books for adults and children and is four-times winner of the Tir na n'Og Wales Children's Book Awards. *The Blue Book of Nebo* is Ros' first YA novel to be published in English, and is published by British Book Awards Wales Small Press of the Year, Firefly Press. The judges admired the “appreciation of language, reading and literature” and described it as “heartbreaking”, “poignant” and “rich with Welsh heritage.”

Following the success of *The Blue Book of Nebo*, Firefly have since acquired two middle-grade titles by Ros, *Feather (Pluen)*, and *Me and Aaron Ramsey (Fi ac Aaron Ramsey)*, to be published in English in 2024. The Shadower's Choice went to former winner Ruth Sepetys for her novel *I Must Betray you*.

Sepetys previously won the Carnegie Medal for Writing in 2017 for *Salt to the Sea* and was shortlisted in 2021 for *The Fountains of Silence*. *I Must Betray You*, a YA novel set during the Romanian Revolution, was called "compelling", "captivating" and "a must-read" by shadower Grace from The Abbey Readers, and Giselle from HAEC Books and Biscuits Carnegie Shadowers group described it as a "powerful and moving historical fiction novel. . . The author explores the themes of freedom, betrayal, and hope in a way that is both thought-provoking and relevant to our own lives."

Both titles are available to borrow from the library now!



On Tuesday, Year 9 enjoyed a trip to the Science Museum, during the trip we visited the Wonderlab! The Wonderlab is spread across seven different zones, giving students plenty of opportunities to interact with real scientific phenomena. We watched live experiments at the Chemistry Bar which including a demonstration using liquid nitrogen! A highlight for most students were the friction slides, which have three lanes made from three different materials: wood, fibreglass and artificial grass, each material causes different amounts of friction.

Langham House Win Their First Sports Day!



On a gloriously sunny day at Perivale Park Athletics Track Langham House secured their first ever Sports Day overall points victory. It was the closest contest in memory with Wigmore, Cavendish and Langham almost inseparable coming into the final few events. Langham had led for much of the day last year but were overhauled by Wigmore in the closing stages. This time they held on for a long-awaited and well-celebrated triumph!

The McLoughlin Cup, a contest between our Year 6's, the staff, and the parents, was also won by Langham, with **Beatrice** and **Dante O** taking the points.

The Victor Ludorum trophies were claimed by Year 7's **Lucy** and **Charlie** from Y10. Lucy took gold in the 100m, 800m and high jump, all with strong performances that matched or bettered the older girls.

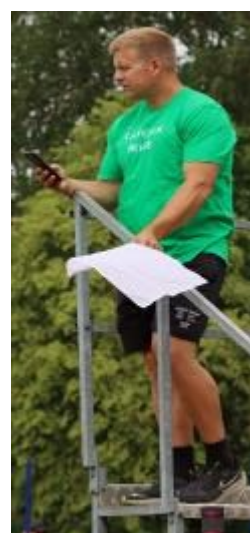

This was a re-arranged fixture from last term held down at Archbishop’s Park on their Astro pitch. Both teams agreed to play 11-a-side, but with small goals, finding the back of the net was never going to be easy. Portland’s Year 9’s dominated this match from start to finish, but their job was far from simple as Fairley fielded a number of strong defenders who pressed and harried our attacking players.

Tec’s name was the first on the scoresheet after he headed home at the far post from **Hazuki’s** corner. But from there PPS’s attempts on goal were thwarted by FH’s defence, despite a few shots going just wide of the post. In the second half, Tec’s free kick skimmed the top of the cross bar, and it was **Ned** who provided the long-awaited second goal after he shot home following a goal-mouth scramble.

The final goal was by far the best piece of build-up play of the match: Hazuki gained possession in the centre and fed it wide to the left to **Felix** who then played back infield to **Yaquob’s** feet just outside the area. Yaquob squared to Tec, who immediately side-footed it to **Danny** who made no mistake slotting the ball past Fairley’s keeper. Four passes in just a few seconds and the ball was in the net!

The game finished 3-0 to PPS, which probably didn’t reflect Portland’s dominance, but was still a fair result given the undersized goals and Fairley’s stout defending. Hazuki enjoyed a more attacking role than he would normally play and was Portland’s best player.
